## 1 聞き取り検査

問題 A 次の会話が 2 回読まれるのを聞いて、問題用紙の指示に従って答える。

John: What do your family usually do on New Year's Day, Akiko?

Akiko: Yes, I thank my grandmother for that very much because she has taught me a lot about *Hyakunin Isshu*. She is a great teacher to me.

John: I see. You have a very good family.

Akiko: Yes, thank you.

## 問題 B 次の英文が 2 回読まれるのを聞いて、問題用紙の指示に従って答える。
