year. (a) I hope you have. I went to the UK one month ago and drew some sketches there. I will send you some of them, and

Now first I will explain the sketch of a pub. Pubs in the UK have a long history. They began nine hundred years ago and there are more than 60,000 pubs in the UK. People, young and old, even children, often go to pubs to eat, drink, meet friends and talk about many things. I went to a pub when I stayed in a village in Yorkshire. I didn't see so many people in this village before going to the pub, but in the evening many people came there. At first I thought they were shy, but they were not. (b) When I joined them, they asked me many questions about Japan and Japanese people. I couldn't speak well but tried to answer them in English. When I

spoke, they listened to me. I also asked them some questions about the UK. When I left the pub, I felt happy. Why did I feel happy? Now I think like this. We are all different. Our cultures, languages and ways of thinking are different. So sometimes it is not easy to understand each other, but we try hard to explain our ideas, to listen to other people and to understand each other. We should have (\mathcal{T}) that kind of communication in our lives. I had such communication in the pub, so I felt happy.

The second sketch is about a man who was selling ice cream in the Lake District. (c) I said to him, "How much is this ice cream?" Then he said, "Three pounds." I said, "OK, I'll have it." When I was paying the money, I found a small poster on his car. I got interested in the words on the poster, "Would you join the National Trust to protect beautiful nature?" I asked him, "Will you explain the National Trust? I'm interested in protecting nature." Then he said, "OK, the National Trust is an organization to protect beautiful nature and historic spots. It started in 1895 and has had about 612,000 acres of beautiful countryside, more than 700 miles of coastline and more than 200 important buildings and gardens. Anyone can join the National Trust by paying some money. Would you join it?" I was interested in nature and history, so I said, "OK, I'll join it. I hope we can protect beautiful nature and historic spots in this way." Then I thought, "The world has become convenient in every way of life, but I can't say we are protecting beautiful nature and historic spots well. They have been there from old times and made us peaceful and comfortable. If we lose them, we can't get them back again. We have to (1)."

This feeling became stronger when I visited Edinburgh in Scotland. I drew old buildings there in the third sketch. People there think history is important and they have protected many old things, like castles and churches, in their city. When I was among those things, I felt that I was living in long history, and I became happy and peaceful. (d) But this city taught me a different thing: (ウ)protecting old things is important, too.
