2 日本の高校生 Akira と Emi は、短期留学先のアメリカで、Jones 先生 (Mr. Jones) と話をしている。その時の会話の一部を読んで、設問に答えなさい。

Mr. Jones: OK. Let's start. First, I'll ask you a question. Can you smell anything when you have a cold? Can you enjoy eating?

Akira: When I had a cold, my nose didn't work and I couldn't smell anything. At that time, I ate curry and rice. It is my favorite food, but I was not able to enjoy it. When I can't smell anything, I can't enjoy the food.

Mr. Jones: We can say that smell influences how much we can enjoy eating food. Can you give me another example? What makes food good? What do you think?

Akira: I think the taste of food makes the food good. For example, many people like chips because they have a salty taste.

Emi: I think color influences how we enjoy food. When I eat foods with beautiful colors, I enjoy eating more. Color is important for me.

Akira: I think people may consider what feeling they have in their mouths. Ice cream is a good example. Some people like it because it is cold and soft.

Mr. Jones: Very good. Many things like taste, smell, color, and feeling influence how we enjoy food. We have one more thing that influences how we like food. Can you guess what it is? It is a A . These days, some studies find that the A is also important when we are eating. One study shows that the volume of the sound people hear when they are eating or drinking can influence how much they enjoy food and drink. In this study, scientists asked forty-eight people to eat chips and cookies. While people were eating, they heard B or C sounds, or they ate with no background sound. The scientists found that when people ate with C background sounds or in silence, the chips tasted saltier and the cookies tasted sweeter, but when they ate cookies in a very noisy place, some of them couldn't enjoy the flavors.

Akira: Now I can understand why I don't think the dishes on the airplane taste very good.

Emi: The volume of sounds is very important to enjoy dishes.

Mr. Jones: The volume of sounds may not only influence flavor. D There is a study to show this. Some people were asked to drink wine in a room by a scientist. While they were drinking red and white wines, one of four styles of music was played in the background. After they finished drinking wine, they were asked to describe the wine. You will be surprised at the result. Their ratings of the wine tended to follow their ratings of the music played in the background. While they were listening to their favorite music, they had a better rating for the wine they drank. On the other hand, (1) [their rating of / the music / the wine / didn't like / made / bad / they]. The scientist says that we tend to think that food tastes good when we listen to relaxing sounds.

Emi: That's interesting.

Akira: I feel comfortable when I listen to pop music. If I listen to it, will I enjoy the food more?

Mr. Jones: That's a good point, Akira. There is another study. (2) 700 people ate several kinds of food while they were listening to different kinds of music like classical music, rock, pop music, and jazz. The study has found that classical music is good for Italian food. (3) Another study shows that playing classical music is more difficult than playing rock music for French people. (4) Rock music is good with spicy food, like Indian curry. (5) People who eat curry when they listen to rock think it is spicier than when they listen to jazz. Jazz is good with sushi or Thai food, and pop music is perfect for Chinese food. The kinds of music may influence how we enjoy the dishes that we eat.

Akira: The things you have told us make me hungry. Let's go out and eat something.

Emi: Where will we go and what will we eat?

Akira: Remember the lesson from Mr. Jones. Let's first decide E .

3 ある企業と大学で行われた研究について述べた英文を読んで、次の設問に答えなさい。

Most people believe that one good way to build a great work team is to choose the best, smartest members. In reality, a team of smart people sometimes works well, but sometimes it doesn't work well. And some teams work well in all of their projects though they don't do the same kind of work in every project. In 2012, one famous, big company in the U.S. started (1) a study. Many experts joined in it to find the key to a perfect work team. They watched how the team members worked and got a lot of data. What makes the difference between good teams and bad teams?

"Do the good team members have a good relationship outside of work?" "How many times have the members eaten out together in a month?" "Do the team members have similar characters?" "Do they have similar backgrounds in education?" "Do they have the same hobbies?" Though the experts tried to find patterns in their relationships, backgrounds, or team culture which are common in good or bad work teams for a long time, it was difficult to find some patterns.

However, they found some patterns. For example, it is very important for all team members to have almost the same speaking time while they are working on a project. In perfect teams, all the members had about the same time to speak out and other members could stop speakers when they wanted. However, in poor work teams, one member spoke a lot while the other members said almost nothing. It is also important for members of perfect work teams to understand how other members feel. They can understand things from other members' positions. The experts say that good team members took care of other members and were kind to them. They made a good atmosphere. (2) These two important things make the members happier and more comfortable.

"I may be disliked by other members." "The members will feel bad when they hear my idea." "My leader will be angry at me." The members must not worry about these feelings and have (3) psychological safety. The members of the team should believe that others will listen to them and will think their ideas are important. They can talk about their ideas without fear and give advice freely.

There were (4) other findings that can influence teams which try to work better, too. In good teams, members look at others' faces directly when they speak, and they use gestures which show they are excited or interested about something. They also communicate directly with each other, though in many other teams they often get others' ideas or new data from their leader. Talking about many things between members during meetings actually makes the work result of the team better. All the findings show the importance of having face-to-face meetings, not phone calls or e-mail communications. University experts say that 35% of a team's work results can be explained only by the number of their face-to-face communications.

Then (5) what should we do to make a good atmosphere at work? We should not keep our real feelings secret or change our character for work. Each member of the teams should be more open about everything at a company. When they talk more openly, the team will work the best. A leader told his team members about a serious disease growing slowly in his body, and then another member talked about her own health problems. Then, every member also talked about personal things, and after that, they began to think how they should work in the team. When (6) each team member [] other members' words and feels relaxed, he or she can give them more new

ideas. Understanding this study will give us a chance to consider how to make better teams.
